#### Pastor's Corner-May 2024 "Power Failure"

Dear Friends in Christ at Faith,

Nothing is more annoying to me than a power failure, especially when it occurs in the evening after dark. Although our cell phones usually still work, our lights, desk top computers, TVs, washing machine, oven, microwave, coffee maker and a number of other devices we have become dependent upon, won't work. We're forced to change our plans and read a book by flashlight or candle light. We also are concerned about the food in our refrigerators spoiling if the interruption goes on too long. We rely upon the ready availability of electricity to carry out our daily lives: without it we feel (pardon my pun) "powerless."

The same is true of our spiritual lives. We have no power within ourselves to believe in Christ or live for Him. Left to our own strength we would quickly wander away from God and not be able to get ourselves back to Him again. That's why we need the Holy Spirit in our lives. Dr Martin Luther, in his Small Catechism's explanation of the Third Article of the Apostles' Creed, tells us: "I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith." These words should be especially fresh in the minds of our 5 confirmands as they speak their vows of faithfulness at our church's altar on the Day of Pentecost, May 19th, this year.

Our ability to believe in Christ and to continue to grow in that faith and walk with the Lord, is dependent upon the Holy Spirit from beginning to end. That's why it is significant that we observe the Day of Pentecost every year, 50 days after Easter, and 10 days after Jesus' Ascension. At His Ascension Jesus promised, "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you shall be my witnesses, in Jerusalem, in Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. (Acts 1:8)" On the day of Pentecost Jesus poured out, upon His first disciples, His Holy Spirit who transformed them from cowards, hiding out from the religious authorities, to bold and courageous proclaimers of the Good News about Jesus.

As the Holy Spirit came to rest on each of them, it appeared as if they had flames of fire upon their heads. They were ablaze with the power of God and compelled to carry out the Great Commission Jesus had given them, to preach the Gospel to all people.

May it be the same for you and me this Pentecost, and especially for our confirmands. May we be renewed in our faith by the Holy Spirit. May we be set ablaze with zeal to witness our faith to all those around us. Let's not be caught in a spiritual power failure. Instead, let's continuously petition God for a greater outpouring of His Spirit so that we may be faithful and effective disciples for Him in the world today. More power to you!




